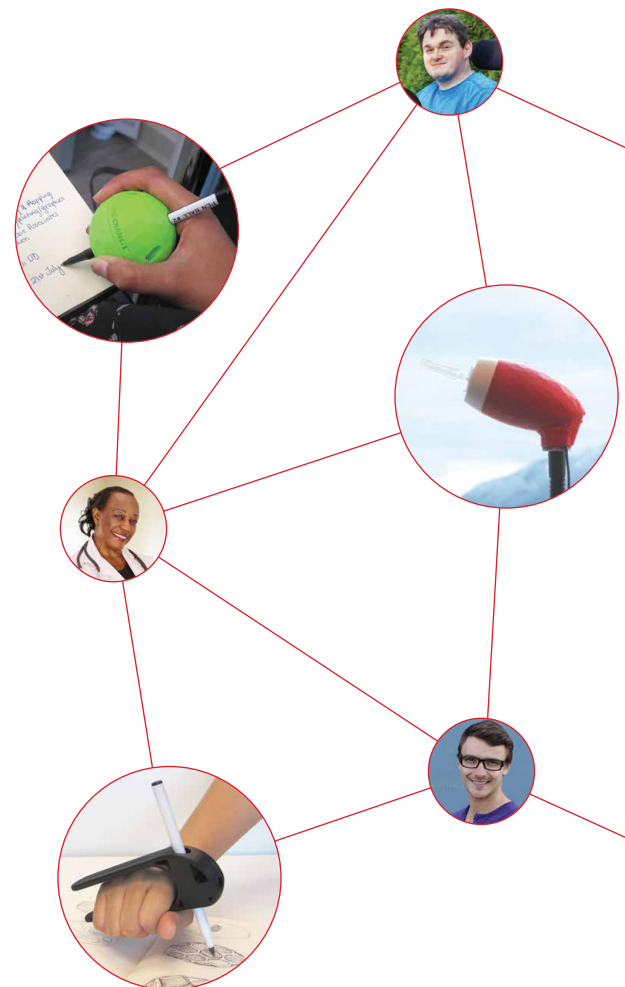

The initiative addresses issues faced by people with disabilities by utilizing the *open source* and maker movement to create affordable assistive technologies at the community level.

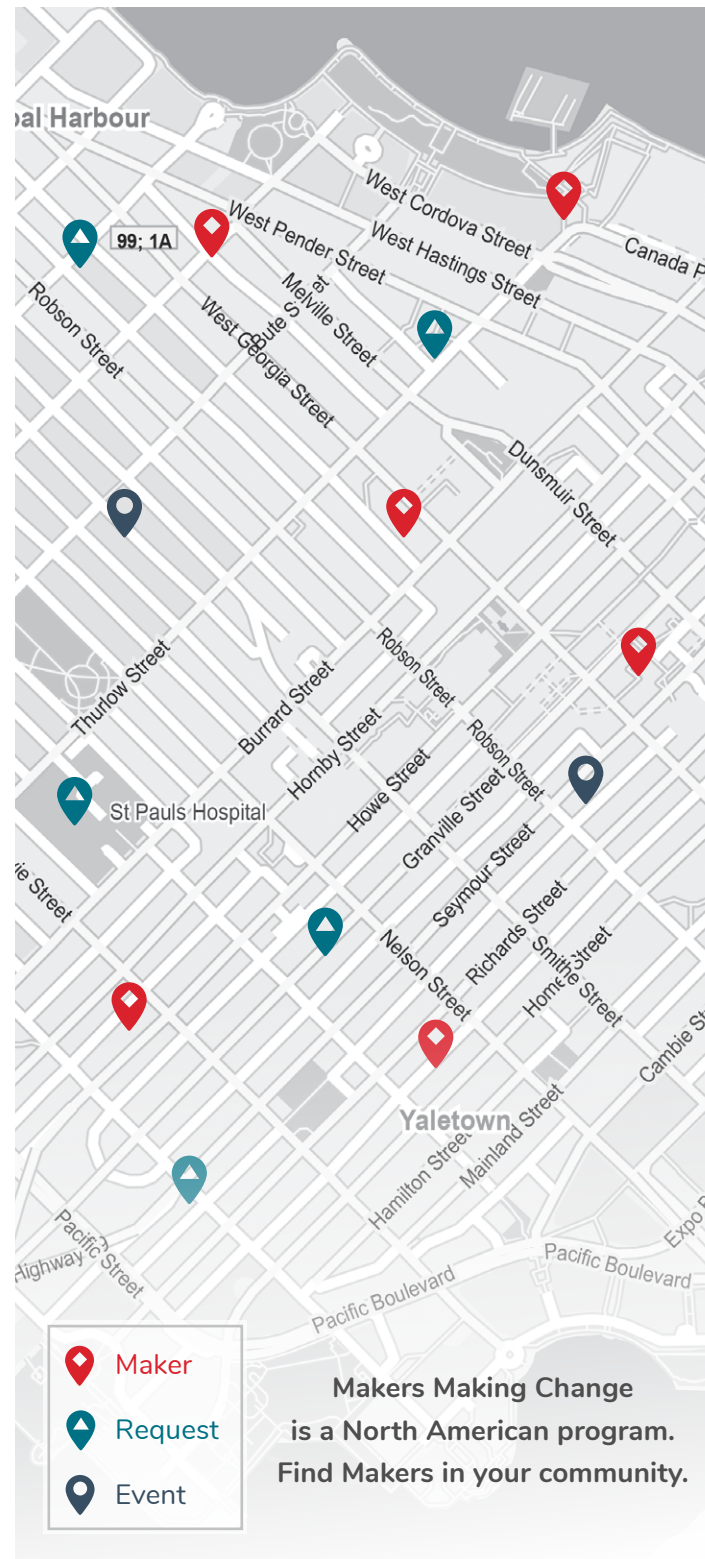


All projects on Makers Making Change are *open source*, allowing designs to be used, modified, and distributed free for personal use.
